



# August 2023 Newsletter



As you know, the proposal to reduce the size of the library was rejected at the City Council meeting on July 19, 2023. The Moorpark Friends of the Library, the Moorpark Women's Club, and many other citizens attended the meeting, expressing their insistence that the library be built at the approved size of 17,500 sq. ft.

Residents of Moorpark love our city—for its open spaces, good schools, safe environment, its history, literally rooted in the soil of its farming community past, being neither too big nor too small, and its vision of a High Street that reflects that history. But none so important as its love of literacy and social health for all its citizens. So, it seemed strange that a question was raised about the possibility of fundraising toward support of the new library. Strange because the organization to do just that and more has existed since 1981, when the Moorpark Friends of the Library became a federally approved [501(c)(3)] nonprofit organization. Even before that, there were "friends" of the library, beginning in 1910, when the Moorpark Women's Fortnightly Club established the first high school and library (see a complete description of all this and a description of our mission on our website at [mfotl.com](http://mfotl.com)).

Every stage of the library's evolution towards something bigger and better for its residents has been initiated or strongly supported by these two organizations. In 2007, a Joint Funding Committee was formed, creating a dynamic plan to involve the Friends of the Library, the Moorpark Women's Club, the Moorpark Library Board, and other organizations in spearheading not just small fundraising efforts but also seeking corporate funding and major sponsorships. That had to be disbanded when a new library was no longer envisioned in the near future.

In 2019, when forecasts for the opening of the new library began to be proposed and predicted for successive new dates, an Ad Hoc Committee was formed from representatives of the Friends of the Library, the Moorpark Women's Club, and the City Library Board, using principles of the previous JFC plan, plus its own concepts to once again reach out beyond the fundraising efforts of the Friends of the Library alone. Again, it was disbanded because an Ad Hoc Committee has a life limited to immediate application, and the predicted opening of the new library was pushed out again and again.

We, the Board of Directors of the Moorpark Friends of the Library, will continue our work of providing funds to enhance programs at our current library and adding to our nearly \$70,000 dedicated solely to the new library. When there is more tangible evidence of the actual building, a new Ad Hoc Committee or something similar to the JFC can be revived.

We are thankful that so many people made their voices heard last week. We are thankful for the continued support in membership and donations, attendance and participation in our fundraising efforts, and volunteer assistance from our general members. We hope for even more participation and response to the call for volunteers at events.




## Porch Sale Recap!

## Annual Membership Appreciation & General Meeting



## The Community Speaks



On July 14, 2023, Moorpark residents learned that the Moorpark City Council's Agenda for July 19, 2023, contained a proposal to reduce the size of the new library from 17,500 to 14,500 sq. ft. This action would thus reduce its capability to satisfy minimum requirements for adequate book collections, meeting space, and other needs determined by previous assessments for a city of this size at this moment, to say nothing of the effect of certain growth of the city in the near future.



Members of the Moorpark Friends of the Library (more than 43 years of recorded history of physical and financial contributions), the Moorpark Women's Club (first founders of the library in 1910), the Moorpark City Library Board (representing official oversight of the library), and other concerned residents responded with their presence and vocal presentations at the meeting.

After some further discussion by the Council, the proposal to reduce the size of the library was rejected, and a formal vote of four yes votes and one no vote affirmed the decision of the Council to approve the size of the library at 17,500 sq. ft.

We are grateful. Now let's move on speedily and effectively to make it happen.

7. When our description appears, click Select.




