The Fundraising committee has been working overtime to bring fresh and exciting ideas to support our beloved library.





Our lovely bookstore volunteers met recently to make improvements to our "Biggest Little Bookstore". Stop by the next time you are in the library, to see the changes we've made! As we receive more donations of children's books than any other type of book, the children's section was in desperate need of expansion. Adult fiction paperback books have been moved from the right side to the left side beside the hardback fiction. There is now a more defined area for classics, vintage (old and rare), and the addition of a Poetry and Plays section. If you are looking for LARGE PRINT books, those are now designated with a bright neon colored round sticker above the price tag. And speaking of LARGE PRINT, we are in need of donations of those books. Harlequin type romance books are on the spinner just outside the bookstore, are priced at \$0.50 each, and many happen to be LARGE PRINT.

There is a Porch Sale going on now, that started on October I. The price is \$5 per bag and volunteers are restocking the sale table on a daily basis. Check it out! My Friends by Frederick Backman


Most people don't even notice them, three tiny figures sitting at the end of a long pier in the corner of one of the most famous paintings in the world. Most people think it's just a depiction of a wide expanse of sea. But Louisa, soon to be eighteen years-old and an aspiring artist herself is determined to find out the story behind these three figures.

More than two decades before, in a distant seaside town, a group of teenagers find refuge from their bruising home lives by spending long summer days on an abandoned pier telling silly jokes, sharing secrets, and committing small acts of rebellion. These lost souls find in each other a reason to get up every morning, a reason to dream, a reason to love.

Out of that summer emerges a transcendent work of art, a painting that, after a chance encounter in an alleyway, will unexpectedly be placed into Louisa's care. She embarks on a cross-country journey to discover how the painting came to be and to decide what to do with it.

As the author of A Man Called Ove, I knew I would enjoy this book but didn't realize how much. The book was a charming, humorous story with characters I came to understand and love. I became invested in discovering what would happen to this important piece of artwork. The author includes this quote that sums up the book beautifully. "The world is full of miracles, but none greater than how far a young person can be carried by someone else's belief in them." I highly recommend this book.


Membership Appreciation ~ Bring a Friend!
